Emergency Management

If helping the community in times of need is important to you, St John can facilitate this through our Emergency Management Arrangements.

St John expertise and resources are used to support the Tasmanian community during times of crisis under the Tasmanian Emergency Management Arrangements. Our members were highly visible at both the Huonville Fires in 2019 and the Dunalley Fires in 2013.

St John members can also be deployed to other States in an emergency when requested. In 2022, multiple members were deployed to assist with the NSW floods.

Our nationally accredited training is provided free-of-charge; all we ask is that you commit to regularly undertaking duties and attending training with St John Event Health Services.

As a Recognised Training Organisation, we acknowledge your prior training. If you have relevant certificates from another RTO, you may be eligible for Recognition of Prior Learning.

- Our AHPRA-registered healthcare professionals, including paramedics, registered nurses, and doctors, hold independent authority to practice and are individually accredited.
- AHPRA-registered enrolled nurses are recognised as Advanced Responders, with opportunities to utilise their skills at larger events when working alongside registered nurses.
- For university students in related health fields, St John offers valuable experience in patient care skills through event exposure and training.

- Volunteers provide comprehensive service delivery. They utilise radio communications and significant infrastructure to handle complex events.
- Volunteers are equipped with defibrillators, oxygen therapy, first response kits, spinal immobilisation gear & advanced resuscitation equipment.
- Health professionals carry advanced patient management gear and follow protocols aligned with clinical scopes of practice.
- All services are covered by St John insurance and adhere to patient care confidentiality requirements.
