

ELECTRICAL SERVICES FIRST AID

This course equips participants with the essential skills and knowledge to respond to first aid emergencies in electrical supply industry environments, including rescue from live low voltage panels. It covers cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), electrical incident response, and first aid procedures aligned with workplace requirements and Australian Resuscitation Council (ARC) guidelines. It is suitable for electricians, apprentices, and others working in or around electrical supply networks.

This course covers the following accredited courses:

- HLTAID009 Provide cardiopulmonary resuscitation
- UETDRMP018 Perform rescue from a live low voltage panel
- UETDRMP010 Provide first aid in an ESI environment

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Participants interested in enrolling in this course must:

- Provide a valid Unique Student Identifier (USI).
- Bring valid photo identification to the course.
- Have a basic level of physical fitness, as the course includes floor-based activities such as performing CPR on a manikin.

(Reasonable adjustments may be available; however, participants must demonstrate CPR on the floor for 2 minutes to be deemed competent.)

- Have basic language, literacy, numeracy, and digital (LLND) skills to follow instructions, complete assessments, and access pre-learning materials.

COURSE DURATION AND DELIVERY MODES

- **8 hours 15 mins (face to face workshop):** This is a face to face course and participants are required to attend full day workshop.

This course is ideal for those working in or preparing to enter the electricity supply and electrotechnology industries who must maintain current Low Voltage Rescue (LVR) and Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) skills.

It is suitable for electricians, apprentices, lines workers, LV switchboard and service technicians, safety observers, and ESI field operators who perform or supervise work involving live low-voltage panels and require compliance with WHS/OHS and industry standards.

A successful outcome for this statement of attainment will be determined by a range of different methods including written assessment, observation of simulated and practical activities etc. Participants will be required to demonstrate practical skills in a simulated work environment consistent with ESI industry conditions.
